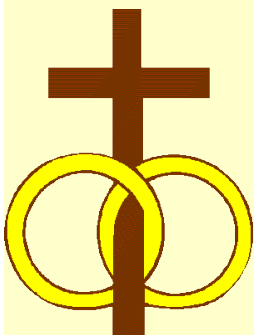

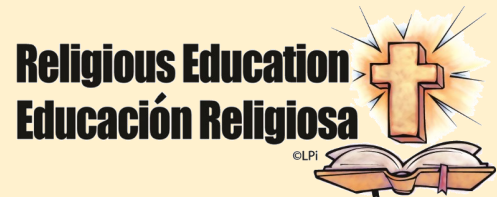

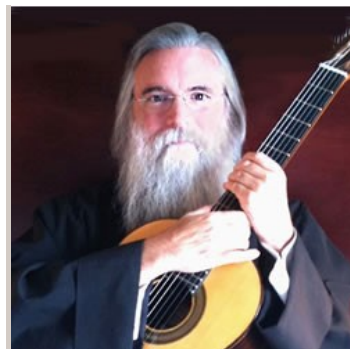

SAINT ROSE OF LIMA

(1586-1617)

Patron Saint of Embroiderers

Feast day is 23 August



Rose, even as a child, had great reverence and love for all things related to God. She lived a life of prayer and mortification. She was very beautiful but she realized that appearance had nothing to do with what a person was on the inside, so she focused on the beauty of her soul. She knew that she would be spiritually beautiful with prayer, penance, and the practice of virtue.

St. Rose worked hard gardening and sewing to support her parents who were very poor. She humbly obeyed them, except when they tried to persuade her to marry. That she would not do. Rose wanted to live for Jesus alone. She joined the Dominican Third Order and lived in a little hut on her parent's property. She frequently visited the Blessed Sacrament and embroidered lace to help support her family.

She had many temptations from the devil. There were times she suffered terrible loneliness and sadness. She cheerfully offered all these troubles to God. She kept praying for her trust to grow stronger. In her last long illness she would pray: "Lord, increase my sufferings, and with them increase your love in my heart."

She was thirty-one when she died on August 24, 1617 in Lima, and her funeral was held in the cathedral. She was the first native born saint of the Americas. She was canonized in 1671 by Pope Clement X.

Everything is connected. Concern for the environment thus needs to be joined to a sincere love for our fellow human beings and an unwavering commitment to resolving the problems of society.

Una sensación de profunda comunión con resto a la naturaleza no puede ser real si nuestros corazones carecen de ternura, compasión y preocupación por los demás seres humanos. No es casualidad que, en el canto en el que San Francisco alaba a Dios por sus criaturas, que va a decir: "Lado seas mi Señor, por aquellos que perdonan por tu amor". Todo está conectado. La preocupación por el medio ambiente por lo tanto necesita ser unido a un amor sincero a los demás seres humanos y un compromiso inquebrantable con la solución de los problemas de la sociedad.

Voter Registration: The Life, Justice & Peace (Social Justice) Ministry of C-IHM in response to the Bishops' *Forming Conscience & Faithful Citizenship* (FCFC / USCCB) is planning to have voter registration after Masses on four weekends until October 9, 2016. It is important to review your standing as a voter in the State of New Mexico. [You can review your status at this website: voterview.state.nm.us] In 2012 voter registration rolls were purged of names of persons who had not voted in previous years. Persons who should consider stopping by to registers are:

- Persons who have moved & changed their physical address since last voting time.
- Persons who will turn 18 by election day – November 8, 2016.
- Persons who have had a change in their name
- Persons who have moved to the area and not yet registered to vote
